Downer Street Corridor Study Public Meeting

Baldwinsville, N.Y. — A public meeting will be held on Wednesday, April 2, 2008, at 7:00 p.m. to discuss issues and needs related to the Downer Street corridor in the Town of Van Buren and the Village of Baldwinsville. The meeting will be held at the Van Buren Elementary School, 14 Ford Street, in Baldwinsville.

The meeting is the first of several for the Downer Street Corridor Study, a planning effort being completed by the Syracuse Metropolitan Transportation Council (SMTC) on behalf of the Town of Van Buren. The purpose of the study is to examine existing and future conditions on the Downer Street corridor, identify issues and concerns, and develop transportation and land use recommendations that enhance both the road and its surroundings. This public meeting will include both a presentation on existing and future conditions and an opportunity for the public to express concerns, issues, and ideas.
