NOTICE OF 30-DAY PUBLIC REVIEW PERIOD FOR THE 2008-2010 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP) DRAFT DOCUMENT

The Syracuse Metropolitan Transportation Council (SMTC) has begun the official 30-day public comment period on the draft 2008-2010 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) document. The SMTC is the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for all of Onondaga County and a small portion of Oswego and Madison Counties. The UPWP is the required document that details the planning activities and funding that will be undertaken by the MPO and its member agencies each year.

The final, approved document is not yet available however, a draft document, which summarizes the program and identifies each of the projects and budgets, is available for review. The public review/comment period commences on February 4, 2008. **Comments received on or before March 5, 2008 will be considered for the final 2008-2010 UPWP**, to be presented to the SMTC Policy Committee for official adoption on March 10, 2008.
