## I-481 Industrial Corridor Transportation Study to be Presented at Public Information Meeting

**SYRACUSE, N.Y.** — The Syracuse Metropolitan Transportation Council (SMTC) will be holding the second of three public meetings for its **I-481 Industrial Corridor Transportation Study** — a study that is examining the transportation implications of current and anticipated office and industrial development in the I-481 Industrial Corridor study area. As part of the study, the SMTC is seeking to identify what actions can be taken to make the most efficient use of the existing transportation system's finite capacity, while carefully considering its impact on the rest of the community (i.e., residents who live and travel along the same road network).

Meeting will be held in cafeteria. Please park in back parking lot, and enter building from rear entrance.

At the July 15<sup>th</sup> meeting, **open to the public**, the SMTC and Parsons Brinckerhoff (consultant hired to conduct the Study) will present the latest round of work performed and information that has been obtained over the past year, including (1) a 20-year build-out analysis of the area; (2) a multi-modal examination of

the adequacy of the local street network and linkages with air, rail, transit, bicycle and pedestrian travel; and (3) the consideration of relevant transportation and land use issues brought forth by the public.

At the meeting, the public will be invited to comment on the information presented, as well as speak out on the next phase of the study process, which involves the formulation of a draft set of\_recommendations, proposed improvements, and an implementation plan that meet the goals and objectives of the **I-481 Industrial Corridor Transportation Study.** Citizen input obtained from this meeting will be considered throughout the remaining stages of the study, and will be factored into subsequent reports, conclusions, and/or recommendations.
