Recommendations from I-481 Corridor Transportation Study to be Presented

SYRACUSE, N.Y. — The Syracuse Metropolitan Transportation Council (SMTC) will be holding the third of three public meetings for its **I-481 Industrial Corridor Transportation Study** – a study that has been examining the transportation implications of current and anticipated office and industrial development in the I-481 Industrial Corridor study area. As part of the study, the SMTC is seeking to identify what actions can be taken to make the most efficient use of the existing transportation system's finite capacity, while carefully considering its impact on the rest of the community (i.e., residents who live and travel along the same road network).
