SMTC Reviews Transportation Development – *Past, Present & Future* -- in Long-Range Transportation Plan 2001 Update

SYRACUSE, N.Y. -- The Syracuse Metropolitan Transportation Council (SMTC) has officially adopted the Syracuse Metropolitan Area's *Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)* – *2001 Update*. The document was officially endorsed by the SMTC Policy Committee on May 14, 2001.

The LRTP is a blueprint to guide the Syracuse Metropolitan Area's transportation development over a 25-year period. Updated every three years to reflect changing conditions and new planning principles, the LRTP 2001 Update looks at major urban transportation planning issues such as environmental/air quality; complete access to transportation; alternative transportation modes (i.e., bicycle and pedestrian); the impact of land development on the transportation system; highway traffic congestion; and maintenance of the existing infrastructure. Also included is the Conformity Analysis, which successfully determines that the SMTC is in conformity with the applicable New York State Implementation Plan (SIP) for air quality in its adoption of a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), Long-Range Transportation Plan, and any pertinent amendments or updates.

The production of the **LRTP 2001 Update** also allowed for public input. Citizens and other interested agencies/organizations were encouraged to review the draft Update and submit comments during the publicized 30-day public comment period (April 13, 2001 through May 13, 2001).
