



Announcement of public comment period Amendment to 2023-2027 Transportation Improvement Program

The Syracuse Metropolitan Transportation Council (SMTC) is seeking public comment on the proposed amendments relative to the 2023-2027 Transportation Improvement Program. This action includes the following:

Change in scope

- PIN 375686 (PAVING, MILTON AVE, COGSWELL AVE TO CAMILLUS LINE, VIL OF SOLVAY, ONONDAGA CO).
 - Sponsor Village of Solvay (Solvay). The Village is proposing to convert the current project into 2 separate phases. The first phase will utilize the current Construction and Inspection funds programmed in Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 23/24 on the TIP. The scope of work changes to Milton Ave from Darrow Ave to Cogswell Ave.

Addition of project

- PIN 375743 (PAVING, MILTON AVE, PHASE 2, CAMILLUS LINE TO DARROW AVE, VIL OF SOLVAY, ONONDAGA CO).
 - Sponsor Solvay. The Village is proposing to program Detailed Design (\$136,000 Flex federal) in FFY 23/24 and Construction and Inspection in FFY 24/25 at \$1,704,000 local funds and \$170,000 local funds, respectively. Compensating offsets provided by outside Metropolitan Planning Area funds and Solvay.
