Announcement of public comment period Amendment to 2023-2027 Transportation Improvement Program

The Syracuse Metropolitan Transportation Council (SMTC) is seeking public comment on the proposed amendments relative to the 2023-2027 Transportation Improvement Program. The action includes the following:

Addition or deletion of project

- Following the latest TAP-CMAQ solicitation administered by the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT), four projects in the SMTC area were identified by Governor Hochul for funding award in June 2024. Projects are listed below, including their total cost to be programmed on the TIP and Statewide TIP and when the Construction phase is anticipated. Preliminary Engineering phases are not listed but are a component of the Total cost.
 - PIN 395087 (VILLAGE OF SOLVAY EMPIRE STATE TRAIL IMPROVEMENTS AND BELLE ISLE RD REPAIR, VIL OF SOLVAY, ONONDAGA CO). Sponsor Village of Solvay. (Solvay) Total cost \$1,004,000 (\$803,000 TAP Federal, \$201,000 match). Construction programmed in Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 26/27.
 - PIN 395088 (INNER HARBOR AREA SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENTS, SYRACUSE, ONONDAGA CO). Sponsor City of Syracuse (Syracuse). Total cost \$3,933,000 (\$3,146,000 TAP Federal, \$787,000 match). Construction programmed in FFY 26/27.
 - PIN 395089 (NEW SHARED USE PATH ON WEST SIDE TRAIL, SYRACUSE, ONONDAGA CO). Sponsor Syracuse. Total cost \$4,930,000 (\$3,944,000 TAP Federal, \$986,000 match). Construction programmed in FFY 26/27.
 - PIN 395093 (CNYRTA ZERO EMISSION HYDROGEN FUEL CELL ELECTRIC VEHICLES AND FACILITY INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT PROJECT). Sponsor Central New York Regional Transportation Authority (Centro). Total cost \$6,250,000 (\$5,000,000 CMAQ Federal, \$1,250,000 match). Funds programmed in FFY 24/25.
- Following the latest BridgeNY program solicitation, in July 2024 four projects were selected for funding. Projects will be added to the TIP/STIP once full schedules are established.
 - W BRIGHTON AVE BRIDGE OVER ONONDAGA CREEK, SYRACUSE, ONONDAGA CO. Sponsor Syracuse. \$1,792,000 Total (\$1,702,000 Federal).

 - Sponsor Syracuse. The City is proposing to add the new project to the program with \$30,000,000 Federal funds awarded through the USDOT’s Reconnecting Communities & Neighborhoods program. Funds will be used for multimodal infrastructure improvements such as sidewalks, bike lanes, and shared use paths in the street Right-of-Way at various locations in the 15th Ward/E. Adams Street Neighborhood. Construction programmed in FFY 25/26.
- PIN 375743 (PAVING, MILTON AVE PH 2, TOWN LINE TO DARROW AVE, VIL OF SOLVAY, ONONDAGA CO).
 - Sponsor Solvay. The village is proposing to remove the project from the current program as the State will provide funding to complete the entirety of the project under PIN 375686.
