Study Purpose

The Midler Ave / New Court Ave Multi-Modal Study is focused on improving and expanding bicycle and pedestrian connections across municipal lines. Along the northern edges of the City of Syracuse, the Court Street / New Court Ave / Midler Ave corridor functions as a singular route connecting the City's Northside, the hamlet of Lyncourt in the Town of Salina, the New Court Ave neighborhood in the Town of DeWitt, and the City's Eastwood neighborhood, eventually leading to the Empire State Trail along Erie Blvd E. This planning effort aims to identify improvements that will:

- Increase pedestrian and bicycle trips,
- Reduce vehicle miles traveled / personal vehicle trips,
- Improve pedestrian and bicycle safety along the corridor,
- Improve accessibility and mobility for all road users, and
- Preserve existing infrastructure and focus investment in areas already served by significant infrastructure investments.









Court St: Grant Blvd to Teall Ave

Court St - Grant Blvd to City/Town Line

Character: Primarily a residential neighborhood with small scale retail scattered along the corridor.



Court St - City/Town Line to Teall Ave

Length: 0.9 miles

of Lanes: 4 (2 in each direction)

Daily Traffic Volume: 13,000

Character: Mixed-use. Small-scale retail along most of the corridor with small pockets of residential development. Community uses, including a school and multiple churches. Light industrial uses closer to Teall Ave





Court St / New Court Ave: Teall Ave to N Midler Ave

Court St - Teall Ave to Swansea Ave

Municipality: Town of Salina

Owner: NYSDOT

Length: 0.3 miles

of Lanes: 4 - 6 (2 - 3 in each direction)

Daily Traffic Volume: 10,000

Character: Commercial and industrial uses directly on the corridor with residential properties nearby. Primarily acts as an onramp to Rt 298 towards Military Circle.



of Lanes: 2 (1 in each direction)

Daily Traffic Volume: 12,500

Character: Primarily residential uses along the corridor with retail and other commercial uses sprinkled throughout. A concentration of commercial uses found near the James St and Burnet Ave intersections
